

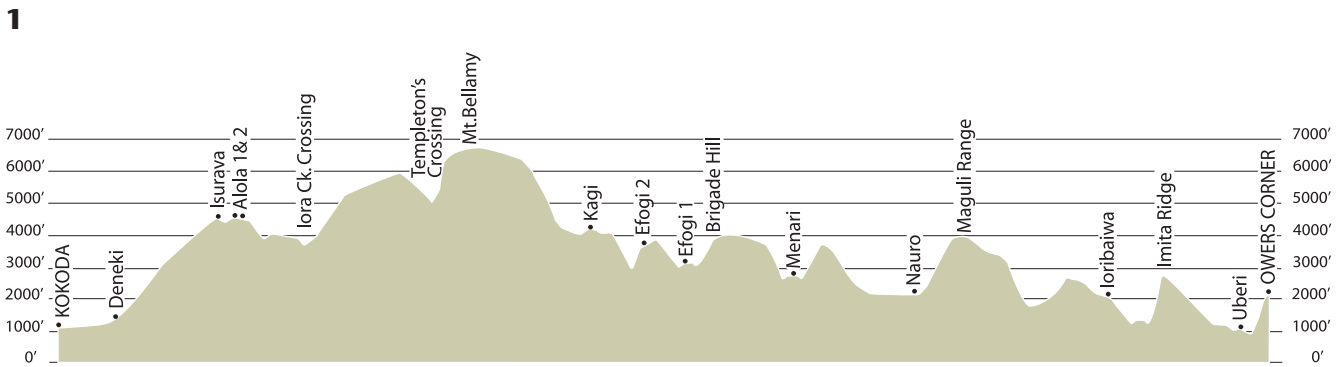
Topic 1: Into battle

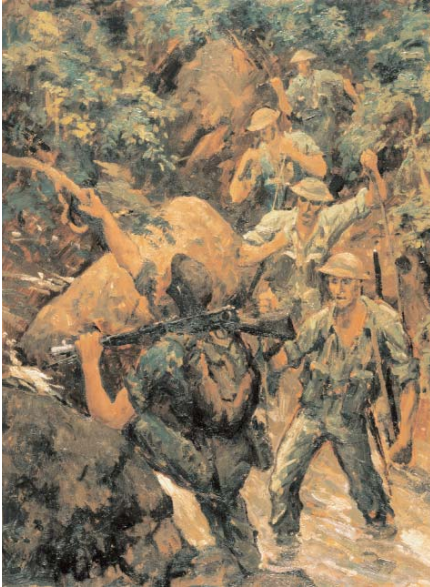
A cross-section of the Kokoda Track shows the back-breaking terrain between Owers' Corner and Kokoda. (1000 feet is approximately 305 metres)

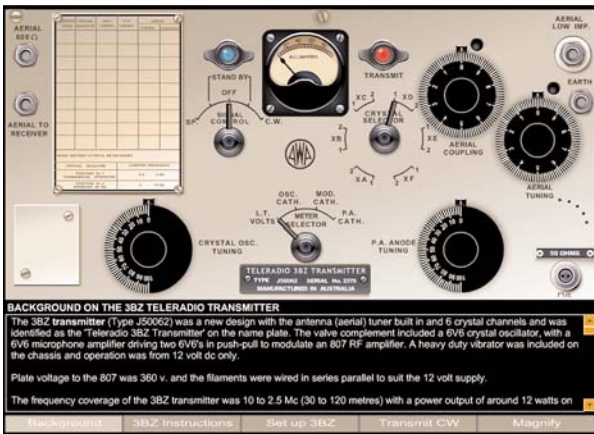
